- a. All departments conduct ICT enabled teaching and learning activities, systematic formative evaluation process and timely remedial measures.
- b. Peer Teaching- Selected students with outstanding skill in specific areas of the curriculum are assigned with a group of students for mentoring and monitoring their progress.
- c. Teaching is not just through lecture mode. Emphasis is given on discussions and interactions as well as lab oriented practical sessions.
- d. Teaching through animations, interesting videos and documentaries.
- e. Field visits to acquire first -hand information are made a part of study.
- f. Uses Virtual labs for Science practical sessions and Language lab for teaching phonetics.
- g. Conduct of lecture series by PG Departments of Mathematics, History and Malayalam.
- h. Bahuvachanam- A common Platform for the PG Departments of Malayalam and History for debating the contemporary Theory and socio-cultural issues and approaches. This forum is not restricted to Malayalam and History people but is open to all subject areas. Anyone who wish to present a topic of common interest is welcome to present papers.
- i. Vayana vaaram (Reading week) -A program of Malayalam Department to enhance the reading tastes of students is conducted for a week (19-22 June 2017) starting from the death anniversary of the pioneer of Kerala 'Granthasahala Prashtanam- K.N.Panicker.

- j. Kavithaykkoppam- is yet another weekly program conducted by students to read and appreciate the Malayalam poetry of various ages.
- k. Organizing different exhibitions and seminars for motivating students to do team work as well to help them understand coordination of various programs of academic and co-curricular activities.
- 1. Academic audit including result analysis and regular PTA meeting to discuss and find solutions to the academic issues if any faced by students.
- m. Projects like Know your Campus Greens, Taxonomy Garden and Live Museum, New Day New Plant of Department of Botany all aims at acquainting the students with the floral diversity, its uses and awareness for its conservation.
- n. Department of Malayalam publishes a Research Journal called Malayala Pacha and maintains a Department Library-MN Vijayan Library.

3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

Under the leadership of National Service Scheme (NSS), the college offers many extension activities to the society. Various activities are organized by the departments and clubs which also help to educate the students about their social responsibilities.

- ⇒ Celebration of important days like World environment Day, World Ozone Day, World Food Day, World Water Day, World Wet Land Day, World Forest Day, Energy Conservation day etc are celebrated by conducting programmes like Quiz, painting, drawing, poster making competitions, thematic exhibitions, awareness lectures etc.
- ⇒ Showing compassion to fellow beings is a big lesson being taught to our students. Our NSS volunteers did various activities like Road Construction, Well Cleaning, Surveys etc during the residential camps. They helped with the cleaning of the Old age home and spend quality time with them.
- ⇒ Regular cleaning work is carried out by the NSS volunteers in some of the Adopted wards in Kodungallur.
- ⇒ Campaigning against the use of drugs is done during the program Vimukthi-Anti Drug Activity.
- ⇒ Dealing with natural disasters and being a part of nation building our students offered various services to the people affected by OKHI disaster in Eriyad area of Kodungallur.

- ⇒ Not only the students, but also our faculty do their share of extension activities. Some of the faculty members gave invited talks on the occasions like Independence Day Celebration, International Women's day Celebration conducted by various social and cultural organizations.
- ⇒ As part of the institutional responsibility, faculty members act as resource persons in various academic programmes in other institutions and also consultancy services.
- ⇒ Institution conducts exhibitions and workshops especially for school students and the public. During Sastrayan 2018, exhibitions of canonical/ classic writers of English Literature and screening of classic film adaptations and phonetics video classes to the public especially school students.
- ⇒ Department of Malayalam organized DTP training in Malayalam for Women as part of Women empowerment. Also conducts UGC NET coaching for pass out students.
- ⇒ Students Union collects food packages and distribute to needy people.
- ⇒ Conducts coaching classes for various competitive exams. Help with free online registration for PSC exams.

Classes were taken in the various topics such as career opportunities, overseas employment, how to attend an interview etc. were taken by experts in the subject matter. Most of the classes focused on the final year graduate and post graduate students because they were ready for employment. There are also programs catering to all students which oriented them about various career prospects, how to choose a career and other related issues.

One of the most attended and appreciated class was on the topic CIVIL SERVICE ORIENTATION by Enrich Academy, Kodungallur, which explained about "How to prepare for IAS examinations". The trainer detailed about various steps from applying for the examination to preparing for the interview. The class was attended by almost all the students in the college.

ATEES staff provided training to the students on the Student Online Reward Test (SORT) which was helpful to equip them with competence and educational qualification on various aspects of employment in the industrial field. The test also assessed the aptitude of the students on their suitability to this career.

Around 25 students attended the interview conducted by Galaxy Institute of Management, Irinjalakuda, which gave them a real time experience of attending an interview and also helped a few students to get into employment after the completion of the course.

For smooth functioning of the office, add on are made at the administration level too. These in turn makes a positive impact on the functioning of the institution. Some of the major innovative approaches adopted are listed below

- a. Department of Malayalam has been upgraded to a **Research Department** during the year and it publishes a Research Journal named "Malayala Pacha".
- b. Establishment of MN Vijayan Library is one innovative way to making learning and research interesting for literature lovers.
- c. Department of Malayalam has constituted 'MN Vijayan Award' for the best BA project/dissertation for promoting literary research and motivating youngsters to take up literary pursuits.
- d. To uphold the moto of the department- "Know nature, Love nature, Live in harmony with nature"- Department of Zoology conducted a series of field visits to give the students an exposure to the beauty of nature and give awareness about the need for the conservation of nature. Students of VI semester B.Sc. Zoology visited Chimmoney Wildlife sanctuary, Thrissur and Nelliyampathy Reserve forest. They visited Zoological Survey of India Regional Station, Kozhikode to get acquainted with research arenas and significant investigations related to Biodiversity.
- e. Use of audio visual equipment and smart class rooms for the delivery of classes especially the language classes using audio and video telecasting especially to teach phonetics. Extensive use of English language lab and the various modes of curriculum transaction including discussion and presentation alongside usual lectures to make the classes more interesting and lively.
- f. Practise for perfection: Department of Botany conducts hands on training for various techniques including cytology, microbiology and Phytochemistry. Department conducted hands on training for Plant Tissue Culture for teachers and students.
- g. Use of virtual labs for induction training for practical sessions is one innovative approach which helps train science students to practice lab sessions.
- h. Kavithaykkoppam (poem review programme), M N Vijayan charchavedi (debate on contemporary issues), Alternate Archives of magazines and Photo gallery of literary figures are being done for making study of Malayalam literature innovative and interesting.
- i. Bahuvachanam- A common Platform for the PG Departments of Malayalam and History for debating the contemporary Theory and socio-cultural issues and approaches.

<u>Title of the Practice – Promoting Science Education</u>

Goal:

"Promoting Science Education" is a continuing project spearheaded by Department of Botany. The project has been recognized as one of the Best Practices of the college as part of the Strategic Development Plan of the College. Through this project students are motivated to take up Science education and select science as a choice for career. This is being achieved through series of Interactive lectures, hands-on practical training as well as motivational workshops. Students are made a part of the conferences/ seminars and symposia being organized by various science departments with external funding (DCE, UGC, KSCSTE etc.). This is done with an aim to provide opportunity to them to understand the progress in the field of science and technology. Apart from this, the youngsters also get to converse and interact with the eminent scientists and academicians during such events. To boost up the scientific temper of the students the Science Departments motivates even the UG students to present papers and posters based on their project works during such seminars.

The Context:

Under the Educational Innovation Scheme of the UGC, the Department of Botany in association with Shiksha Trust, Hyderabad and Inspire Learning Classrooms Pvt. Ltd., (Kerala), started this project as an extension activity venture to extend their services to the society to Promote Science Education among the School students of selected Govt. Schools in and around Kodungallur. The students of the department acted as 'Student Tutors' during these training program for school children which helped them to hone their skills in various science activities as well as boosted up their self-confidence and team spirit.

The Practice:

This programme which was officially inaugurated on February 19, 2015 by the veteran educationalist and motivational speaker **Dr. T P Sasikumar**, the chairman of **Shiksha Trust** and Founder Director of Destination IAS. Later all the science departments joined together to take this forward as a Best Practice of the institution. As continuation of the programme, various programmes were organized by the Science departments during 2017-18.

❖ Department of Botany organized Lecture workshop on "Frontiers in Biotechnology" (November 22-23, 2017) for teachers and students with the support of Directorate of

- Collegiate Education (DCE), Govt. of Kerala. Provided hands on wet lab experience on Plant Tissue Culture.
- ❖ A Lecture on 'Self -discipline by studying Mathematics' was conducted by Department of Mathematics on July 11, 2017.
- ❖ Students of final year degree course were encouraged to apply for the Scheme for Promoting Young Talents in Science (SPYTiS), supported by Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE). Nine projects got accepted and financial support was released for taking up mini projects on various topics including Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology.
- ❖ Science Awareness Week (November 7th to 14th) was celebrated under the leadership of NSS units of the college. During the Science Awareness Week Celebration various classes to Popularize Science were conducted in association with Sastrasahitya Parishath.
- ❖ To Promote Science Education, National Science Day was celebrated on February 7, 2018 with the financial support from KSCSTE. The theme for the day was Science For Sustainable Future. The celebration included an orientation lecture for College and school teachers on Teaching Excellence for Science Teachers by Prof. NR Premakumar, quiz competition for school students and elocution competition for college students.
- ❖ All the science departments of the college took part in **Science Popularizing** event of the Government of Kerala- **SASTRAYAN** during February 27-28, 2018. During the event exhibitions, lectures, documentaries and competitions were organized for students (both school and college), teachers and public.
- ❖ Computer Literacy to Kudumbasree Members was a well appreciated event organized by Department of Computer Science during Sastrayan.
- ❖ The Department of Physics has an **Electronics Club** which is a hobby group that aims to teach and help students to understand the seemingly incomprehensible electronic gadgets in the world today, and also assists them in developing their own devices. The LED bulbs assembled by the final year B. Sc Applied Physics students were exhibited and put on sale during Sastrayan.

<u>Title of the Practice – Snehasparsham: the Touch of Love</u>

Goal:

The aim of this practice is to provide an interface between the campus and the society. It is mainly an outreach program to offer community level services by the campus. It makes it a mandate to put to use the facilities and expertise available with the institute to the best services of the community. This best practice is spearheaded by the National Service Scheme (NSS) in association with all the Departments of the college and various clubs like Nature club, Bhoomitra club and the students union.

The Context:

Government institutions like our college should be of service to the public if the real purpose of the institution is to be served. Apart from the primary duty of imparting academic excellence to the students-the primary stakeholders- the institution should consider the other stakeholders majority of which comes under the general public in and around the college. Through providing services to the society, we would not only be doing an extension activity but also is realizing the Vision and Mission of the institute- Enlightenment of the society and empowerment for a worthy global citizenship. Community interactive activities will also help to inculcate in the young minds of the students a sense of social responsibility. These ventures will furthermore open up new gateways to overcome the social, economic, and educational backwardness of the region.

The Practice:

Snehasparsham- includes many activities which are intended to be of benefit to the society, which gives life lessons to students to grow into responsible citizens who respects the rights of others, believes in gender equity, show environmental responsibility and overall empathy and reverence to fellow beings. Activities are designed to give special emphasis on women empowerment and self- employment. Gives thrust to getting to know our tradition and history. Regular campus cleaning, Reusing Plastic Waste, popularizing triple R (Reduce-Reuse-Recycle), greening of the campus, establishment of teaching herb garden, celebrating various days related to environment etc. are some of the best practices relating to this. Various activities under taken during the year towards this venture are briefed.

❖ NSS led the World Environmental Day celebration in the college on June 5, 2017. With the collaboration of Kerala Forest Department and Bhoomitra Sena and Nature clubs of the college, plants were distributed to students and trees were planted in the campus

- as part of greening of the campus. Tree saplings were also distributed among staff and interested public.
- ❖ On the occasion of Gandhijayanthi (October 2nd), extensive campus cleaning was undertaken. Initiatives to establish a **Biodiversity Garden** was inaugurated by Smt. Suma Narayanan, Ward Councillor, Kodungallur.
- NSS Volunteers also participated in a **survey for Cancer Detection** organized by Vellangallur Gramapanchayath during the month of October, 2017.
- ❖ Organ Donation Awareness class was conducted on November 16, 2017 in association with the ALUMNI of the college. During the occasion Organ Donation Agreement was obtained from volunteers.
- ❖ AIDS: Reality and Notions- an **awareness lecture on AIDS** was conducted on December 6, 2017. The lecture was presented by Dr. Sandeep Sreeharshan, Resident Medical Officer, Emergency Medicine Department, Aster Medcity Hospital, Kochi.
- ❖ Compassion to fellow being: After the OKHI cyclone disaster which spread havoc throughout Kerala, the NSS volunteers of KKTM Govt. College extended their services to the people of Eriyad, a place near Kodungallur.
- ❖ Food package distribution is regularly done by the students union to the needy and poor, especially the poor patients in government hospital in Kodungallur.
- ❖ Environment responsibility: to inculcate environment responsibility among the students and spread awareness about conserving nature for sustainable development various activities are conducted throughout the year.
- ❖ NSS volunteers organized **Energy Conservation Day** (December 14, 2017) celebration which included programs like painting and drawing exhibiting the importance of Energy Conservation.
- ❖ Department of Botany and Department of Zoology in association with Department of Social Forestry (Thrissur) celebrated **World Wet Land Day** on February 2, 2018.
- ❖ An awareness lecture on Vanishing Wetlands A Threat To Water And Food Security by Dr. S. Sreekumar (Visiting Professor, Dept. of Environmental Sciences, University of Kerala) was conducted on February 8, 2018. A poster exhibition on the theme "Wet Lands for our Future" was organized by Department of Botany.

- ❖ Visit to old age homes is also taken up by various departments from time to time. This year NSS volunteers visited 'Sangameshalaya'- a home for Old aged people on Christmas day.
- ❖ During the seven day camp of the NSS (December 22-27, 2017), volunteers took up activities including Road Construction, Well Cleaning and Surveys.
- Cleaning of adopted wards of Kodungallur was done during the month of January, 2018 by NSS volunteers.
- ❖ ABHAYAM- Home for the Homeless is an initiative of NSS of the college to help construct home for the needy, especially the deserving students of our college. During 2017-18, the NSS has started the construction of a house for one of our students of Department of History in Eriyad Gramapanchayath.
- ❖ Inculcating moral values and good habits among students is also a part of Snehasparsham. Vimukthi-Anti Drug Activity is one such venture which is a drug eradication program conducted by the Excise Department of the State. NSS volunteers actively participate in the various program connected with this.
- ❖ Community services are extended in form of Entry to Service-a coaching program to face various competitive exams, coaching for National Eligibility Test etc are provided free of cost to students and public.
- ❖ Student counselling for both academic and non-academic purposes are undertaken by the faculty as per the need for not only the students of the college but also to students of other institutions.
- ❖ Palliative Care is yet another societal obligation activity taken up on a regular basis by NSS. Volunteers participated in various programs like rallies, seminars etc. in connection with Palliative care.
- ❖ Sports training: Department of Physical Education in collaboration with the SkyHIgh Tennis Academy, (Irinjalakuda) provided tennis coaching to the students of various schools in the adjacent community. Around 20 kids from 5 years onwards actively participated in the summer camp held during April and May, 2018. Apart from the faculty of our college, an experienced and AITA certified coach was in charge of the training programme. The coaching camp still continues during weekends and holidays.
