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M S Dhoni

Mahendra sing Dhoni is a former Indian cricket captain

who captained the Indian national team in limited-overs formats from 2007 to 2017 and in Test cricket from 2008 to 2014. MS Dhoni is the only captain in the history of cricket to win all ICC trophies.[3] Under his captaincy, India won the inaugural 2007 ICC World Twenty20, the 2010 and 2016 Asia Cups, the 2011 ICC Cricket World Cup and the 2013 ICC Champions Trophy. A right-handed middle-order batsman and wicket-keeper, Dhoni is one of the highest run scorers in O Day Internationals (ODIs) with more than 10,000 runs scored and is considered an effective 'finisher' in limited-overs formats.[4][5][6] He was also the first wicket-keeper to effect 100 stumpings in ODI cricket.[7] Dhoni's skill in the cricket field has been praised by cricketers such as Kapil Dev, Adam Gilchrist, Nasser Hussain and Kevin Peterson who have often ranked him as one of the greatest wicket-keeper batsmen and captains in the history. Dhoni made his ODI debut on 23 December 2004 against Bangladesh, and played his first Test a year later against Sri Lanka. He has been the recipient of many awards, including the ICC ODI Player of the Year award in 2008 and 2009 (the first player to win the award twice), the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna award in 2007, the Padma Shri, India's fourth highest civilian honour, in 2009 and the Padma Bhushan, India's third highest civilian honour, in 2018.[9] Dhoni was named as the captain of the ICC World Test XI in 2009, 2010 and 2013. He has also been selected a record 8 times in ICC World ODI XI teams, 5 times as captain. The Indian Territorial Army conferred the honorary rank of Lieutenant Colonel[10] to Dhoni on 1 November 2011. He is the second Indian cricketer after Kapil Dev to receive this honour.

10 Dhoni is the most successful Indian cricket captain who win all the
11 ICC trophies. Dhoni also holds numerous captaincy records such as
12 the most wins by an Indian captain in ODIs and T20Is, and most
13 back-to-back wins by an Indian captain in ODIs. He took over the
14 ODI captaincy from Rahul Dravid in 2007 and led the team to its
15 first-ever bilateral ODI series wins in Sri Lanka and New Zealand.
16 In June 2013, when India defeated England in the final of the
17 Champions Trophy in England, Dhoni became the first captain to
18 win all three ICC limited-overs trophies (World Cup, Champions Trophy
19 and the World Twenty20). After taking up the Test captaincy in 2008,
20 he led the team to series wins in New Zealand and the West Indies
21 and the Border-Gavaskar Trophy in 2008, 2010 and 2013. In 2009,
22 Dhoni also led the Indian team to number one position for the first
23 time in the ICC Test rankings.

25 In 2013, under Dhoni's captaincy, India became the first team in
26 more than 40 years to whitewash Australia in a Test series. In the
27 Indian Premier League, he captained the Chennai Super Kings to
28 victory at the 2010, 2011 and 2018 seasons, along with wins in the
29 2010 and 2014 editions of Champions League Twenty20. In 2011,
30 Time magazine included Dhoni in its annual Time 100 list as one of
31 the "Most Influential People in the World." [11] Dhoni holds the post
32 of Vice-President of India Cements Ltd., after resigning from Air
33 India. India Cements is the owner of the Indian Premier League team
34 Chennai Super Kings, and Dhoni has been its captain since the first
35 IPL season. [12][13] He announced his retirement from Tests on 30
36 December 2014. [14]

38 In 2012, SportsPro rated Dhoni as the sixteenth most marketable
39 athlete in the world. [15] He is the co-owner of Indian Super League
40 team Chennaiyin FC. [16] In June 2015, Forbes ranked Dhoni at 23rd
41 in the list of highest paid athletes in the world, estimating his earnings
42 at US$31 million. [17] In 2016, a biopic M.S. Dhoni: The Untold Story
