

## Artocarpus hirsutus Lam.

Family: Moraceae

Common name: Wild jack

Vernacular name: ആഞ്ഞിലി

Nativity: South West India

**Habit:** Tree

Habitat: Evergreen to Semi Evergreen forests

**IUCN Status:** Least Concerned

**Keynotes:** Artocarpus hirsutus commonly known as wild jack is a tropical evergreen tree species that is native to India, primary in Kerala, but also Karnataka, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, where it prefers moist, deciduous to partially evergreen woodlands. The Artocarpus hirsutus grows in altitude ranging from sea level to an elevation of 1000 m in palaces with an annual rainfall of 1500 mm or more . The canopy tree can reach a height of up to 35 m and about 4.5 m in girth.

**Uses:** Its bark cures diabetes, tapeworm infection, anaemia, malarial fever, asthma, dermatitis, diarrhoea, pimples and ulcers.
