### Qualitative analysis of Criterion 1

KKTM Govt. College-Kodungallur Kunjikuttan Thampuran Memorial Government College follows the Choice Based Credit Semester System and curriculum prescribed by the affiliating University, the Calicut University. The College offers 8 UG, 3 PG and 1 research centre. In addition, a couple of departments offer add-on courses dealing with the environmental sustainability, gender awareness, human values and professional ethics. Faculty members maintain individual diary which is a repository of the academic events and delivery of curriculum effectively. The conduct of internal examinations is time bound and the results of the students are discussed in the Parent-Teacher-Student meetings periodically and the college has made suitable provisions of remedial classes to the weaker students. A well-organized feedback system systematically collects responses from teachers, students, alumni and stakeholders based on which necessary measures are taken for recommendations and rectification. The feedback responses are discussed in the concern meetings for information and seeking action. The faculty members actively participate in curriculum design, implementation and research Boards of Study, Doctoral Committees, Curriculum Review/Restructuring Committees, Question Paper Setting and Panel of Subject Experts of the affiliating university. The academic calendar is meticulously prepared and implemented effectively. The college strictly follows the state Government and affiliating university norms for granting reservations in admissions.

#### Qualitative analysis of Criterion 2

The College admission process is carried out through the Centralized Allotment Process [CAP] of the affiliating university, the University of Calicut. Based on the last five years average percentage of marks for admission in the college, 91.81 and 89.64 percent was the cut off percentage of marks for admission for the General and reserved category, respectively

The college academic calendar is prepared at the beginning of each academic session. The strengths and weaknesses of students are analyzed with the help of continuous and comprehensive evaluation system. Faculty members use to keep the IQAC cell updated about the performance of students in order to improve their academic and non-academic performances. Tutorial classes are regularly conducted to bring the weaker students at par of other students. The outcomes of such exercises are communicated to the parents of such students. Result analysis of each semester is meticulously examined by IQAC cell to improve the academic standard of the college. Average pass percentage of the college students was 70.27 percent during the last five years and it needs further improvement. The possibilities of blended learning are experimented and ICT enabled teaching pedagogy is underway to make the teaching more effective and interesting. Faculty development programs are also conducted under the aegis of IQAC, but it needs Guest speakers from reputed organizations. The POs, PSOs and COs are uploaded in the college website periodically and the faculty members also take the responsibility to make the students aware about the use and relevance of such academic outcomes. Participation of students in POs and COs are evaluated by the faculty members and based upon the continuous evaluation along with student's performances in the external examinations. Some of the students of the college have achieved rankings in the affiliating university annual examinations.

#### Qualitative analysis of Criterion 3

The College has one recognized research centre at the Department of Malayalam. *Malayalapakcha*, the research journal of the Malayalam department is included in the UGC CARE List and has published about 14 volumes since its inception. All issues of the Journal are available in the webdeveloped in collaboration with SNGS Pattambi. *Cognizance* is one another research journal published by the college. A few college teachers are actively performing the responsibilities of research guides and in view of this several disciplines running in the college have approached the affiliating university to recognize their departments as a research centre for the doctoral works. The college has designed a research policy document framing the guidelines for research work. As per the provisions of the affiliating university, all the Under Graduate Departments' final year students have to undertake and complete a project work which is a mandatory requirement for the completion of the Undergraduate Degree Course. The college has utilized 254000 rupees grant during the given assessment period. The College maintains a small historical museum, M N Vijayan Library besides running Botany Museum, Tissue Culture Lab, Fernery, Butterfly Garden, Computer lab and an English Language Laboratory. The college is runs a Centre for Continuing Education and offers its infrastructural facilities to the external organizations including the Kerala Public Service Commission to conduct the written test of various competitive examinations. The college has conducted 87 Seminars/workshops on IPR, Research Methodology and Entrepreneurship. But the printed copies of proceedings of such events were not available. Publications of faculty members appeared in UGC-CARE, SCOPUS and Web of Science journals as well as books' chapters indicate the presence of research culture in the camps. There are a few clubs functioning at the college, enriching the innovative academic atmosphere. But effective documentations of such clubs are missing. The college signed MoUs with couple of organizations for ensuring a plastic free green campus as well as to exchange the faculty expertise and resources. The NSS actively involves in various extension activities and the college supports the local community during natural calamities. The college takes special interest in the protection of the ecologically sensitive mangroves to sensitize the public to sustain the ecological equilibrium in the region.

#### Qualitative analysis of Criterion 4

The college campus is spread in 25 acres of land with spacious classrooms. The research block of the campus is developed with the assistance of RUSA grant in aid. The new library block is completed with the assistance of state government whereas the girls' hostel was constructed with the financial assistance of State and University Grants commission. The new academic block of the campus was developed with the help of Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Board (KIIFB). A new girls hostel has come up in the campus with the all modern facilities to accommodate 25 inmate. The Library is spread over in three floors and its covered area is 13810 Sq.ft. Besides having 37529books, the college subscribe16research journals, 15 periodicals and 5 newspapers. Out of the specified number of books, 1500 books are reference books and it includes Encyclopaedias, Dictionaries, Books on Malayalam, English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Mathematics, Computer Science, History, Political Science, Economics, Public Administration, General Reasoning and Aptitude Abilities. The Library offers access to INFLIBNET and N-LIST resource, which is a vast repository of online journals and e-books. The library functions by using the software KOHA. Each faculty and students can access library information online. Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) for book search, internet browsing facility for staff and students N-List E-resources from the website are available in the Library. The institution has a Wi-Fi connection from BSNL with a bandwidth of 60 Mbps. Further the college is connected with a broadband connection of Kerala Vision with a bandwidth of 200 Mbps. It has been upgraded to complete networking which enables access to the internet through more than 200 Ethernet points in the entire campus.

<p>The College strives hard to disseminate information about the available opportunities of higher studies as well as organizations concerned offering scholarships to the meritorious and reserved category students in higher degree courses in the country and abroad. To make the students articulated in professional skills, the college has established language and communication lab, ICT skill centre as well as LifeSkills Development cell. The College has also developed fitnesscentre and it helps the enrolled students to keep robust healthas well as athletic body. The computer lab helps the students to improve computing and software skills. The college has made progress in providing career counseling to the students under the aegis of Career Guidance Cell. The college has also run SC, ST and OBC Cell. The Vision 22, one of the pioneering initiatives of the college, is aimed at providing coaching to students free of cost for their entry into the professional organizations. The video lectures of teachers are uploaded to You Tube which is posted in the website so that both the students and the public have access to it. The grievances of students are taken care of with much caution and are addressed on priority basis. The students are advised about the menace of ragging and it is absolutely banned in the campus. The students have been made informed of the fact that their education doesn't cease to exist soon after they step out of the college on successful completion of the course. Instead, they are encouraged to be a part of placement drive to catch a rewarding job. The students are also urged to appear in the competitive examinations like civil service, GMAT,CAT,TOEFL,etc. Some of the studentshave won awards and medals for their outstanding performances in sports and cultural activities at state and national levels. Such achievements have inspired the remaining students doing hard to perform excellence in sports and cultural activities. The alumni association has contributed significantly in the form of financial support. The college runs is a cooperative society to meet the stationary requirements of the students. A programme 'earn while you learn' is run by the college to the needy students.</p>

#### Qualitative analysis of Criterion 6

The institution is headed by the Principal and assisted by office superintendent. The perspective plan of the college is usually approved by the college council and is submitted for further execution. The admission and examinations are conducted with the support of the faculty members systematically. The performance appraisal system of the faculties is monitored periodically for career advancement. The faculty members are encouraged to participate in the workshops and conferences and it makes their professional and academic behavior more effective. Faculty members are also motivated to do the Faculty Development Programmes. The institution adheres to the service rules in accordance with the UGC and State Government of Kerala. Teaching faculties are recruited by Kerala Public Service Commission as per the regulations and norms of UGC and the KSR& SSR. Non-teaching staff is also recruited by KPSC in accordance with KSR & SSR. The institution offers welfare schemes like GPF, SLI, GIS, GPAIS, MEDISEP, Pension Schemes, Maternity and Paternity Leave, and LTC. The college has made the provisions of both internal and external financial audits. Available funds are optimally utilized for the holistic development and growth of the college. No funds have so far been underutilized or unutilized due to laxity. The quality assurance initiatives have been undertaken under the direction of IQAC Coordinator. The regular meetings of IQAC strictly monitor and review the plan of action the college has undertaken. The feedback received from all stakeholders are analyzed by IQAC and remedial measures are undertaken wherever it is required. The *touch of love (snehasparsham)* is one of the philanthropic and innovative exercises of the IQAC offering free medicines to the marginalized communitieswards.

The College celebrates all national and international days including the World Environment Day to sensitize the students and faculty members not only on the heritage of our country but also to keep the students and faculty aware about the Nature's conservation to check the emerging issues like the Climate Change. The college is invariably disabled' friendly with the provisions of suitable ramps wherever necessary. The college has made efforts for the water conservation (fresh water system)and rain harvesting. The college has also developed a biodiversity garden. Energy and green audits are undertaken periodically. However,to keep the students involved in such practices, the college has made the provisions to sensitize the students on Climate change, Global Warming, Social Harmony, constitutional obligations and hygiene and sanitation.The college is proactive in social commitment as it has developed an historical museum in the campus. The two best practices that the college seems to have been involved, the first one isto offer hunger free campus programme under which heavily subsidized food is offered to the poorest students under the banner of *Kudumbasree* and the second one is free distribution of medicines to the students and local people under *Snehasparsham*. To promote science education, the college is striving hard and making efforts to organize symposiums, lecture series and laboratory experiments.Such nature of exercises' helps the students to usher into the threshold of scientific knowledge.
