On June 6, 2022, World Environment Day, the Department of Botany, in collaboration with the Nature Club, arranged a visit to the mangrove ecosystem close to our college campus. Dr. Sujana K A, Scientist E from the Botanical Survey of India, Southern Regional Centre, Coimbatore, was the speaker. Seventy two students participated in the programme. The talk was much inspiring.
