The first meeting of the committee was convened at the Principal's Chamber, in the presence of the Convenor and the members of the committee on 07.06.2023. It was decided to distribute posters to all departments, office, library, canteen, corridors etc. to spread awareness on anti-ragging among students. Colour posters were distributed and exhibited in all the above-mentioned places on the college campus. The anti-ragging committee also decided to collect duly signed anti-ragging affidavits from both students and their parents and also decided to maintain them in the custody of the convenor of the committee.
