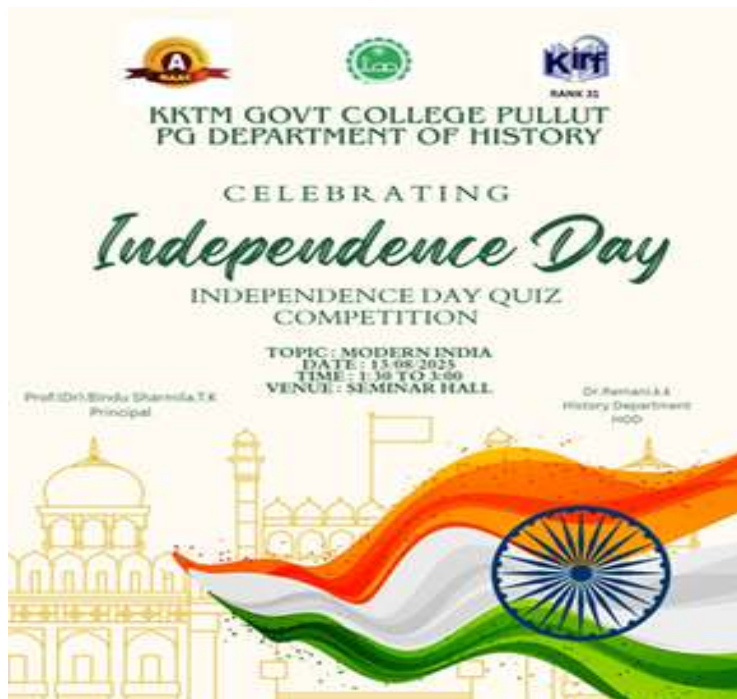
Commemorations of M. G. S. Narayanan

Narayanan (1932–2025) was a renowned scholar of Kerala's history, particularly noted for his work Perumals of Kerala, critical epigraphical research, and transformative influence on historiography in Kerala.he praised MGS's scholarly integrity and contributions to historiography and MGS as "the first true professional historian of Kerala," emphasizing how MGS transformed historical methodology in the region . M. G. S. Narayanan was a towering figure in Kerala historiography, known for his scholarly contributions as head of the Department of History at Calicut University and as Chairman of the Indian Council of Historical Research .

HERITAGE WALK

The multidisciplinary syllabus (MDC) heritage walk, organized by the Department of History, provided a hands-on learning experience for 34 students, integrating aspects of history, art, architecture, and cultural studies. This initiative aligned with the goals of the MDC curriculum by offering an interdisciplinary approach to education that allows students to gain in-depth, experiential understanding outside of traditional classroom settings.



The development of the metro system has significantly contributed to the growth of tourism by providing a fast, reliable, and affordable mode of transport for both local and international travellers. Cities that have introduced metro systems, particularly in popular tourist destinations, have witnessed a boost in tourism as these systems make it easier for visitors to explore multiple attractions efficiently. The Kochi Metro in Kerala has had a transformative impact on local tourism. By connecting key locations, including shopping areas, cultural sites, and residential neighbourhoods, the metro has enabled tourists to experience the city in a convenient and eco-

friendly manner. The integration of art and culture into the metro stations has also added an element of tourism appeal, as stations showcase local art, traditional Kerala murals, and eco-friendly designs.



Hill Palace was the official residence and administrative headquarters of the erstwhile Cochin Maharajas, built in 1865. Historical & Cultural Learning A visit here helps students understand: The history of the Cochin Kingdom and how royal administration functioned. Cultural artifacts like jewellery, manuscripts, ancient coins, ornaments, and weapons. Kerala's traditional architecture (e.g., ettukettu style buildings). Gallery displays of Indus Valley models and prehistoric relics. The museum has around 14 exhibit categories, including royal heirlooms, paintings, epigraphy, sculpture, and household artifacts from earlier centuries.





visit to the historic Jew's Synagogue (Paradesi Synagogue), is an enriching experience that brings participants face-to-face with the layered history of Kochi, Kerala. The Jew's Synagogue, one of the oldest active synagogues in the Commonwealth, stands as a testament to the Jewish community's significant presence in Kerala. Built in 1568, it is a beautiful structure adorned with hand-painted blue and white Chinese tiles, each unique, that were added to the synagogue's floor in the 18th century. The walk often includes a tour of the synagogue's interior, where participants can see the ancient Torah scrolls, brass pulpit, and Belgian glass chandeliers, each adding to the historical richness of the space. It also provides an opportunity to explore the surrounding Jew Town, which is filled with antique shops, spice markets, and small cafes. This area adds an additional layer of charm to the heritage experience, as participants encounter various cultural influences that have shaped Kochi over the centuries.

Day 1: Thrissur – Mangalore

our journey started from Thrissur Railway Station. We travelled by train to Mangalore Railway Station. It was a full day journey by train and bus. The journey gave students an opportunity to interact with each other and prepare for the study tour.

Day 2: Hampi

we reached Hampi at 6:15 am. After reaching, we freshened up around 6:00–7:00 am and had breakfast at 8:15 am. We then visited several important monuments including the Elephant Stable, Lotus Mahal, and Queen's Bath which reflect the architectural brilliance of the Vijayanagara period. Lunch was arranged at 2:15 pm. In the afternoon we visited the famous Vittala Temple and later climbed Matanga Hills to witness the beautiful sunset. Dinner was arranged at 7:30 pm and we stayed overnight at the hotel.

Day 3: Hampi

We checked out from the hotel at 8:30 am and had breakfast at 8:45 am. Our first visit was to the Virupaksha Temple, one of the oldest and most significant temples in Hampi. Students also spent time shopping in the nearby markets. Later we visited the Lakshmi Narasimha Statue which is one of the largest monolithic statues in Hampi. After lunch at 2:00 pm, we visited the Archaeological Museum which houses many historical artefacts from the Vijayanagara Empire. In the evening we trekked to Anjaneya Hills. Dinner was at 8:30 pm and we stayed overnight at the hotel.

Day 4: Badami

we checked out from the hotel early in the morning at 5:15 am and proceeded to Badami at 5:30 am. Breakfast was arranged at 9:30 am. In Badami we visited the famous Badami Cave Temples, the local museum, and Badami Fort which are important examples of Chalukyan architecture. Lunch was arranged at 2:30 pm. Later we visited Pattadakal where we explored the Durga Temple and Lad Khan Temple, both significant monuments of early temple architecture. Dinner was arranged at 8:00 pm and we proceeded to Gokarna at 9:30 pm.

Day 5: Gokarna

we reached Gokarna at 6:00 am and freshened up. Breakfast was arranged at 8:30 am. We visited the scenic Om Beach and Kudle Beach which are famous tourist attractions in Gokarna. After lunch we visited Mirjan Fort and the famous Murudeshwara Temple. Students also had time for shopping. In the evening we proceeded to Mangalore Railway Station at 6:00 pm. After dinner, we were dropped at the railway station at 9:30 pm.

Day 6: Mangalore – Thrissur

On the final day we departed from Mangalore Railway Station and travelled back to Thrissur. The journey concluded successfully with students returning with valuable knowledge and memorable experiences from the study tour.

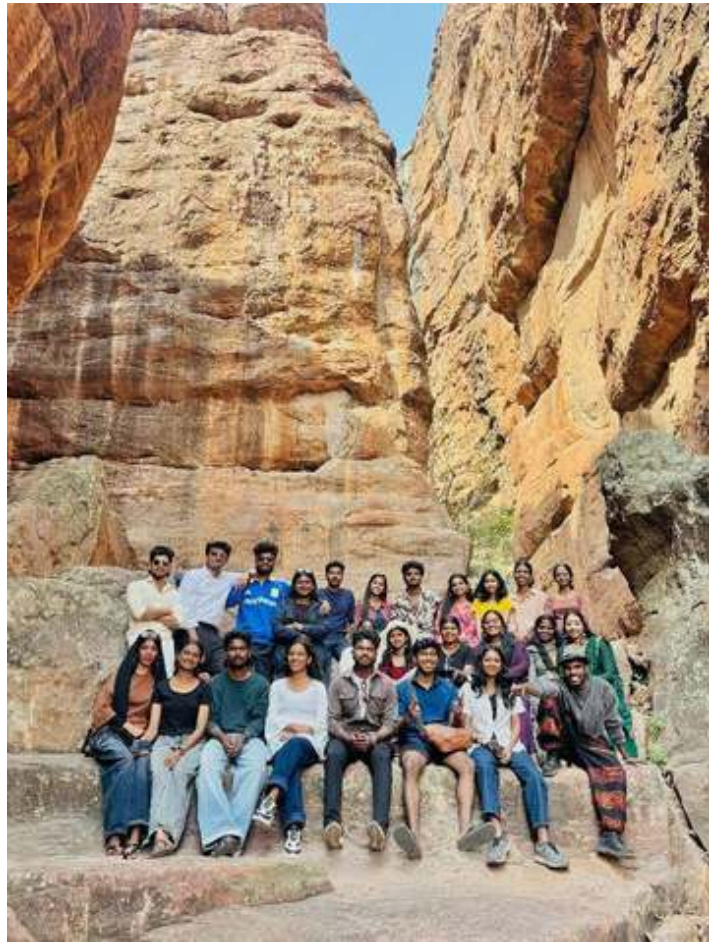

M.A. HISTORY STUDY TOUR (2024–26)

As part of the curriculum of the M.A. History Programme under the University of Calicut, the final-year students of the Department of History conducted a study tour to Agra, Udaipur, Jaipur, Ajmer, Jaisalmer, Punjab, and Delhi from 14-02-2026 to 27-02-2026. The team consisted of 13 students (1 boy and 12 girls) and was accompanied by two faculty members from the department.

We started from the college at 2:00 p.m. on 14-02-2026 and boarded the train from Thrissur at 5:30 p.m.



We reached Agra at 10:30 a.m. on 16-02-2026. At Agra, we visited the Taj Mahal, an ivory-white marble mausoleum situated on the southern bank of the Yamuna River. It was commissioned in 1632 by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his beloved wife Mumtaz Mahal. The monument is the centrepiece of a 17-hectare complex that includes a mosque and a guest house. It was designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1983 and is regarded as one of the finest examples of Mughal architecture. In 2007, it was declared one of the New Seven Wonders of the World.





On 17-02-2026, after breakfast, the team visited Udaipur, often referred to as the “Venice of the East.” The city is surrounded by the Aravalli Hills and is famous for its beautiful lakes. We saw the Lake Palace situated in Lake Pichola, the City Palace, and Sajjangarh (Monsoon Palace). Udaipur was founded in 1553 by Maharana Udai Singh II as the capital of the Mewar Kingdom.





On 18-02-2026, after breakfast, we visited Pushkar, a sacred town for Hindus. The Brahma Temple, one of the few temples dedicated to Lord Brahma, is located here. Pilgrims gather in large numbers during the month of Karthik to take a holy dip in the Pushkar Lake. Later, we visited Ajmer, an important spiritual and historical center of Rajasthan. The city is renowned for the Ajmer Sharif Dargah, which attracts pilgrims of different

faiths. We also visited Foy Sagar Lake, an artificial lake constructed in 1892 by the British engineer Mr. Foy to provide famine relief employment.





On 19-02-2026, after breakfast, the team visited Jaipur, the capital of Rajasthan, founded in 1727 by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II. Popularly known as the “Pink City,” Jaipur is recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage City. We visited Amber Fort, located about 11 kilometers from Jaipur. Built in 1592 by Raja Man Singh I, it is a splendid example of Rajput and Mughal architectural styles. We also visited the City Palace and the Hawa Mahal. Hawa Mahal, built in 1799 by Sawai Pratap Singh, is known as the “Palace of Winds” and was constructed to allow royal women to observe street life without being seen.





On 20-02-2026, we visited Jaisalmer and the Desert National Park, which showcases the unique ecosystem of the Thar Desert. The park is home to animals such as blackbuck, chinkara, and desert fox.

On 21-02-2026, we explored Jaisalmer, popularly known as the “Golden City.” We visited Jaisalmer Fort, also called Sonar Qila, a living fort built in the 12th century. Later, we visited Patwon Ki Haveli, Nathmal Ji Ki Haveli, and Gadisar Lake, which reflect the rich architectural heritage of Rajasthan.





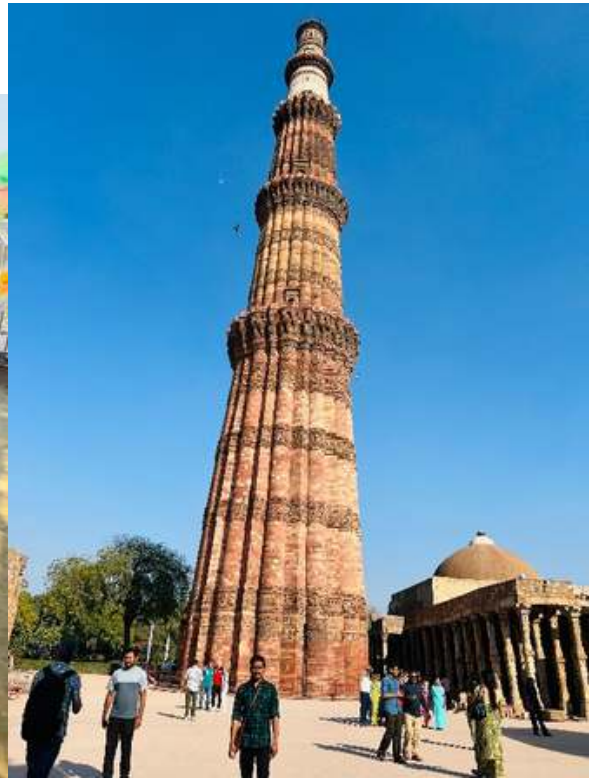
On 22-02-2026, at midnight, the team reached Amritsar and viewed the Golden Temple at night. On 23-02-2026, after breakfast, we visited Jallianwala Bagh, a historic site associated with the tragic massacre of April 13, 1919. We also visited the Golden Temple (Harmandir Sahib), one of the most sacred pilgrimage sites of Sikhism. The temple is surrounded by the holy tank known as Amrit Sarovar. On the same day, we visited the Wagah Border, famous for the daily flag-lowering ceremony conducted by Indian and Pakistani soldiers.



On 24-02-2026, we reached Delhi. After breakfast, we visited Sarojini Market and the Indira Gandhi Museum.

On 25-02-2026, the team visited major landmarks in Delhi, including the Birla Mandir, India Gate, Lotus Temple, and Qutb Minar. India Gate, originally known as the All-India War Memorial, was designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens and commemorates Indian soldiers who died in World War I. Qutb Minar, built in 1199 by Qutb-ud-din Aibak and later completed by Iltutmish, stands at a height of 72.5 meters and is one of the tallest brick minarets in the world. The Lotus Temple, completed in 1986, is a Bahá'í House of Worship known for its unique lotus-shaped structure made of white marble.





On 27-02-2026 at 5:00 p.m., the tour team safely reached the college, marking the successful completion of the study tour.

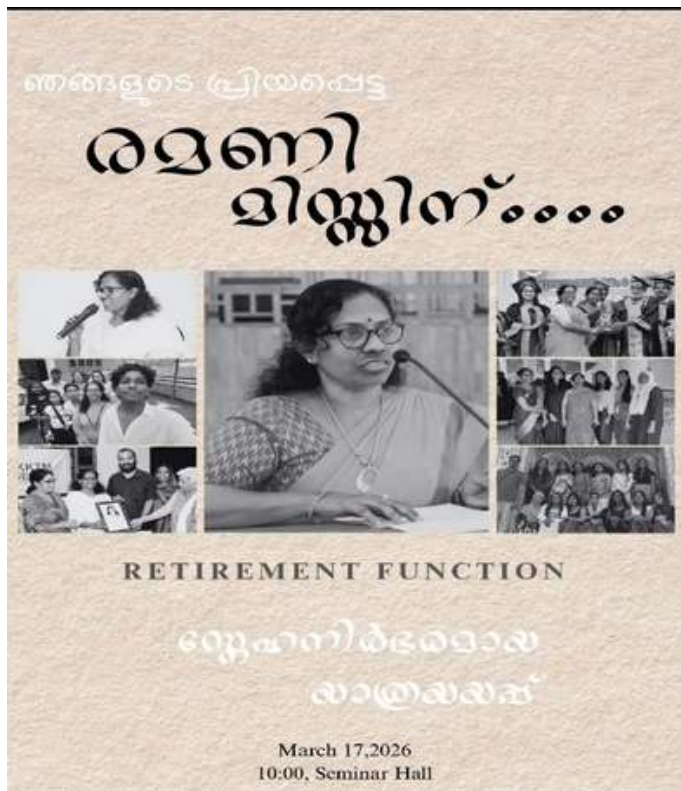

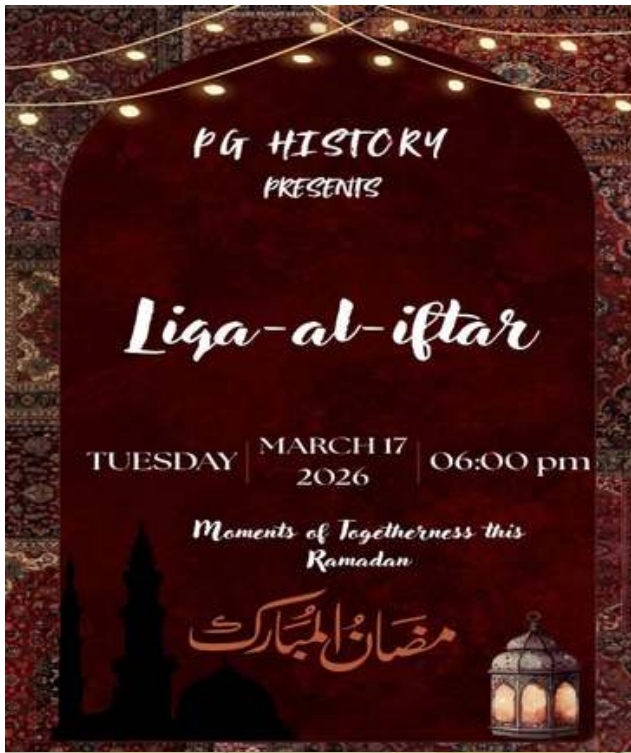
