World Environment Day Celebration

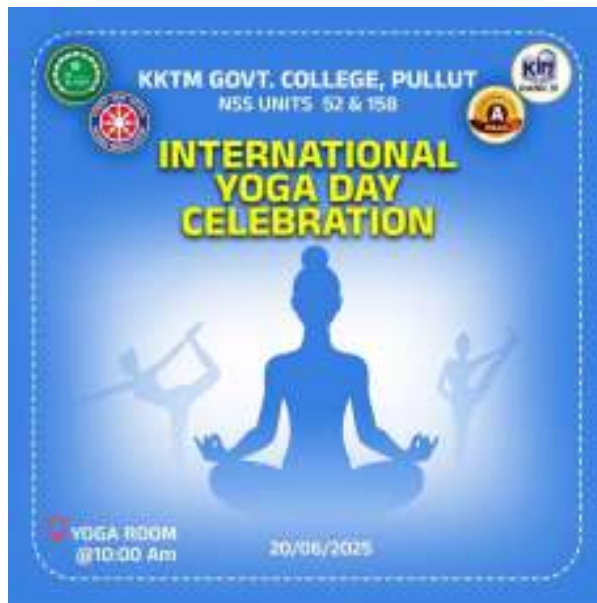

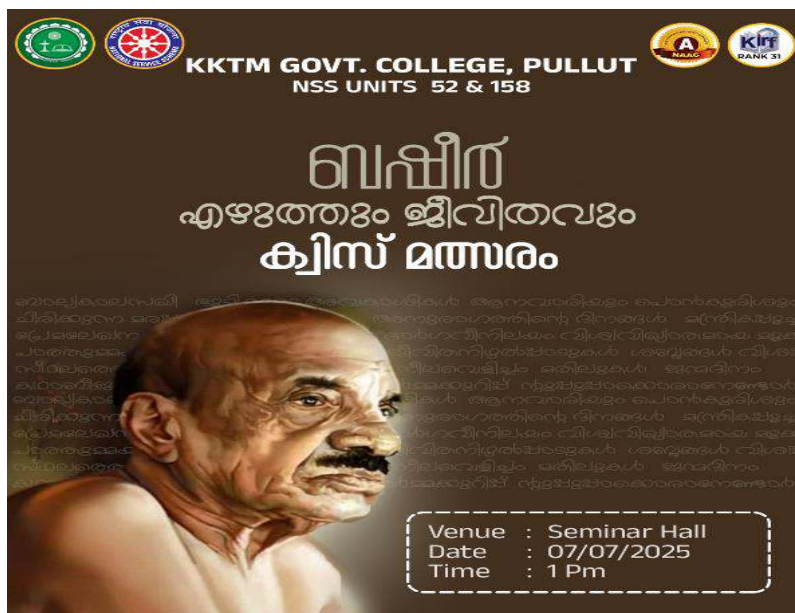

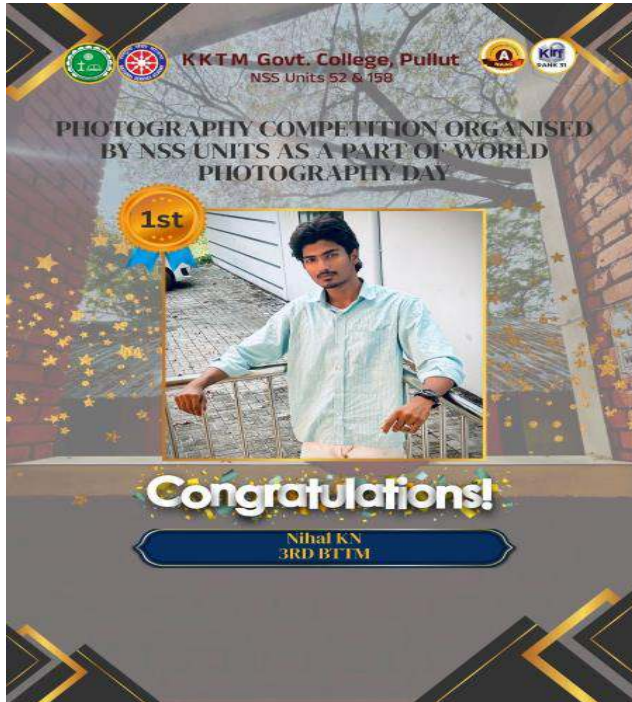
In observance of World Photography Day on 19 August 2025, the NSS Units organized a Photography Competition for all students of the college. The competition was conducted under the theme “Faces of

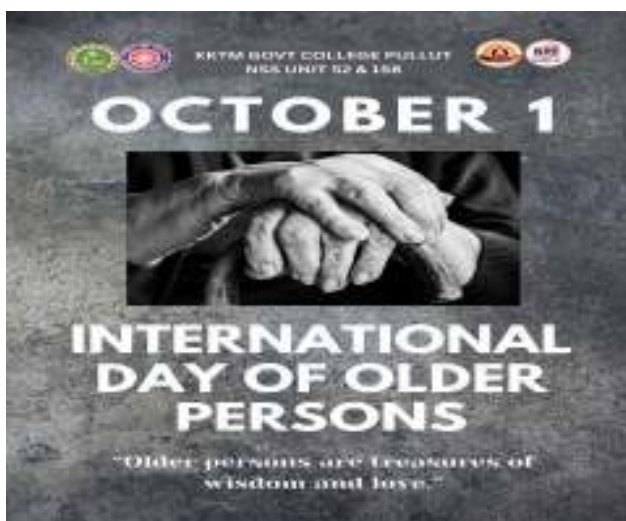

Digital Crop Survey

The NSS volunteers of K. K. T. M. Government College, Pullut, Thrissur, actively participated in the orientation programme on the Digital Crop Survey (DCS) organized by the Directorate of Agriculture Development and Farmers' Welfare, Government of Kerala. The programme was held as part of the implementation of the Centrally Sponsored Scheme – Digital Crop Survey Kharif 2025–26.

The session highlighted the importance of the Digital Crop Survey as a key component of the Digital Public Infrastructure for Agriculture, aimed at collecting accurate crop data for every farmland plot. Through the integration of farmer and land records with geo-referenced data, the DCS system generates verified and reliable crop information to support decision-making, policy formulation, and risk management in agriculture.



Volunteers gained awareness of how digital tools and applications facilitate accurate crop estimation, promote soil health management, and ensure better market planning. The programme also emphasized the role of technology in providing personalized advisories to farmers, thereby enabling informed and timely decisions.



The participation of NSS volunteers in this initiative proved to be highly beneficial, as it helped them understand the importance of digital transformation in the agricultural sector and encouraged them to contribute actively to awareness and field-level data collection initiatives in the future.

As part of this initiative, the survey was carried out in villages within a structured timeframe — starting 30 days after the date of planting or sowing and completed at least 15 days prior to harvesting. The survey involved digital data entry through the DCS Mobile Application, which required trained individuals to collect field-level information about crop varieties, sowing patterns, and cultivation details.

The NSS units of K.K.T.M. Government College, Pullut, Thrissur, actively participated in this major agricultural data collection drive. A total of 12 NSS volunteers from the college joined hands with the local Krishi Bhavan officials to support the implementation of the Digital Crop Survey in nearby panchayats.

The volunteers were trained to use the mobile application designed for DCS, following the registration and login protocols under the supervision of Agricultural Officers and Assistant Agricultural Officers. Each volunteer helped collect field-level data, verified cropping details, and assisted in uploading accurate information through the app. Their local knowledge and commitment contributed significantly to ensuring data reliability and efficiency in the survey process.

The participation of college NSS volunteers in this government-led program exemplified the spirit of community engagement and social responsibility. Through their active involvement, the volunteers gained valuable exposure to digital data systems, agricultural monitoring, and field-level coordination, thereby bridging the gap between technology and rural development.

The Department of Agriculture and local authorities appreciated the dedicated efforts of these NSS volunteers for their valuable contribution toward the successful execution of the Digital Crop Survey 2025-26. Their participation not only strengthened the data collection process but also highlighted the vital role of youth in supporting sustainable agricultural development.
