1. International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking

"The evidence is clear: invest in prevention."

The General Assembly declares June 26 to be the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking each year to raise awareness of drug-related issues and to strengthen collaboration and action towards the goal of a world free from drug abuse. The International Day declaration was started by the UN Office of Drugs and Crimes to guarantee the distribution of accurate drug-related information from several sources and to protect the right to health.

The Anti-Narcotic Committee (CPG), NSS units (52, 158), and the Department of Zoology, in association with IQAC, jointly celebrated

Anti-Drug Day on Wednesday, 26th June 2024. The program started with a flash mob by NSS volunteers and hoisting signs with anti-drug abuse slogans. Smt. Megha P. M., CPG Coordinator, delivered the welcome speech and welcomed the principal to provide the message for students. Our principal, Dr. Bindu Sharmila T. K., delivered a speech for students that mentioned the increasing misuse of narcotics by the younger generations and shared some drug abuse incidents in society. She specified how technology has adversely affected students' lives and its widespread abuse among the younger generation. The anti-drug pledge was also taken by everyone in attendance. A vote of gratitude was given by Dr. Dhanya P. D., the coordinator of the college's NSS program, to end the session.

Quiz and poster-making competitions were conducted to create awareness about the importance of anti-drug day.

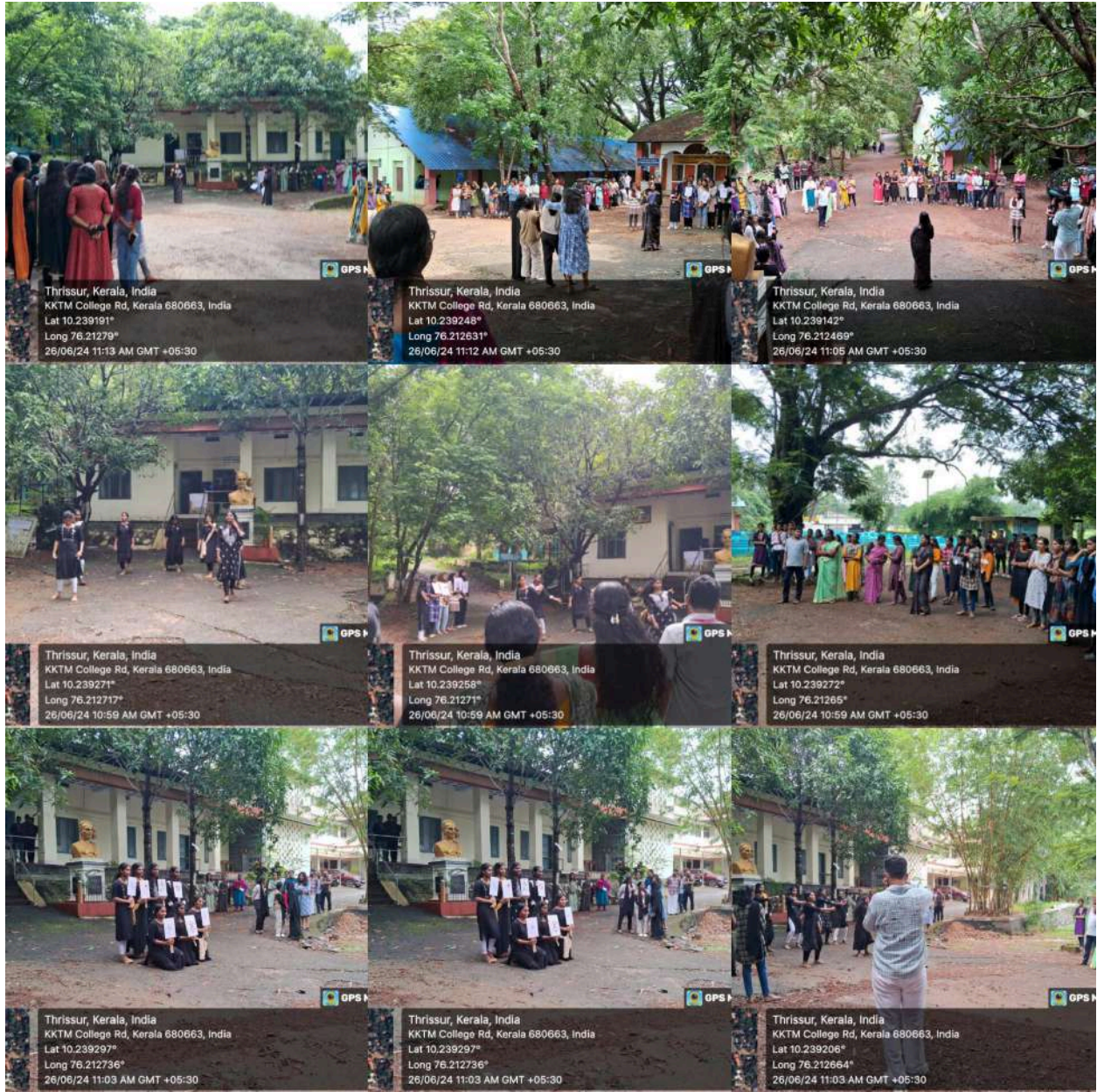

A joint meeting was held at the college auditorium on 05-11-2024, which was led by the KKTMM Government College Protection Group and included students availing temporary accommodation facilities in the vicinity of the college, their parents, College Protection Group members, College PTA executive members, the College Union Chairperson, and some social workers from the vicinity. 158 people participated in this joint meeting. College Protection In-Charge Megha P. M., assistant professor, Department of Mathematics, welcomed all the dignitaries who attended the meeting. The meeting was chaired by the college principal, Dr. Bindu Sharmila, who is also the chairperson of the college protection group. Talking about the heritage of the college, the principal explained the agenda of the meeting, which was the complaints related to students studying at KKTMM Government College and availing of accommodation facilities provided by private individuals or institutions in the vicinity of the college. She mentioned that some residents of the college are seeing students of this college at night in the vicinity of Thachappilly Bridge and that complaints are being received in person and over the phone. She said that the complaints clearly show that students living in places not under the direct control of the college are being seen in this way, as the students of the college-controlled hostel are not allowed to go out after 7 pm. The principal reminded them that children should pay more attention to their studies and that running away from studies will make children

slaves to various addictions. It was also informed that there is a possibility of incidents of violence against students by anti-social elements during the night. She also reminded students of the idea of giving up friendships that distract from the goal. It was also informed that students who avail accommodation facilities in places not under the control of the college should try to reach their accommodation as early as possible (7.30-8.00 PM). Parents were advised to always call their children and get information about their welfare. It was stated that the institution would stand by the students for their legitimate rights, but students who engage in illegal activities will be responsible for their actions.

The students who were included in the complaints received advice from the other esteemed guests.

Key suggestions were put forward by the College Protection Group

1. A decision was made by ASI Shafeer Babu Sir of Kodungallur Police Station to hold a joint meeting of the homestay operators, municipal office bearers, and college authorities at Kodungallur Police Station to outline general guidelines for the management of homestays operating in the surrounding areas not under the control of the college. The meeting was convened as soon as possible.
2. Since around 230 students are availing of this type of accommodation facility, steps should be taken to immediately prepare men's and women's hostel facilities with government benefits in KKTU Government College.
3. A platform should be created for the welfare information and problems of the students availing accommodation facilities in places not under the control of the college, along with their tutors and the respective department heads.

He also discussed daily life cybercrimes. He explained that the importance of cybersecurity lies in its ability to protect personal data, guarantee online safety, protect enterprises, and assist national security. He also gave information about improving cybersecurity: avoid public Wi-Fi for sensitive information, update software regularly, and be cautious of phishing scams, among other things. To conclude the session, Dhanya Mohan O, the Cyber Cell coordinator, delivered a vote of thanks. Around 174 participants attended the program.
